Found Alphabet Project

Description

As photographers, we often look for interesting situations, places, and things that have the potential for making good photographs.

Sometimes we see something that looks like something else, such as a cloud that looks like an animal, car, or face. Turn your skills of perception toward finding and photographing things that look like letters of the alphabet.

For this project, we will produce all 26 letters of the alphabet and assemble the photographs into a display.

Note

It's not enough to make a picture that looks like a letter...You have to make an interesting and well-composed image, too!

Alphabet Trivia

Q. Is the letter A the first letter of every alphabet?
